ASSESSMENT

Listening — 25 %	Exam at the end of year 11
Reading — 25%	Exam at the end of year 11
Writing — 25 %	Exam at the end of year 11 including translation and essay writing tasks.
Speaking — 25 %	Exam at the end of year 11 including 2 minute role-play, a 2-3minute photo card description and a 4-7 minute general conversation.

Course Description.

- ⇒ Learn and practise vocabulary on a wide range of topics including self and family, hobbies, technology, global and social issues, travel and tourism, school and future study and employment.
- ⇒ Recap and extend your knowledge of grammar touched upon in years 7-11 to allow you to use the language more independently.
- ⇒ Extend your knowledge of grammar to enable you to speak and write without support or notes and be able to translate both into and out of the target language.
- ⇒ Develop your listening and reading skills so that you can pick out key information you need from a conversation or from a longer written passage.
